



Serranía de las Quinchas: establishment of a first protected area in the Magdalena Valley of Colombia

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En la actualidad, la Serranía de las Quinchas alberga el mayor fragmento de bosque húmedo presente en el valle del río Magdalena en Colombia, refugio para numerosas especies endémicas y amenazadas como el Paujil de Pico Azul *Crax alberti*. En 2003, la compañía dueña de gran parte de los terrenos en la Serranía se derrumbó financieramente, por lo cual propuso subastar sus tierras, resultado que seguramente hubiese desembocado en una masiva deforestación. La Fundación ProAves, preocupada y alarmada por los posibles resultados de la venta de tierras a colonos, inició una urgente y a la vez fuerte campaña con el fin de comprar estas tierras y establecer así una reserva natural para la conservación de toda la biota amenazada en esta zona del país. Dicha reserva natural finalmente se denominó Reserva Natural El Paujil. Este artículo hace énfasis sobre la importancia de conservación al nivel mundial de la Serranía de las Quinchas así como también discute pasados y futuros procesos de conservación para esta importante región. Adicionalmente incluye una lista actualizada de las especies de aves presente en la Serranía.

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Serranía de las Quinchas holds the largest remnant block of humid forest in the Magdalena Valley. It is a unique refuge for many threatened and endemic species including the Critically Endangered Blue-billed Curassow *Crax alberti*. The massif forms part of the west flank of Colombia's East Andes and includes a variety of ecosystems, from humid lowland forest to lower montane cloud forest. It rises from 150 m to over 1,800 m elevation.

Colombia's humid Magdalena Valley forests formerly constituted one of the world's richest lowland biotas, continuous with the Chocó region. However, the río Magdalena and its valley have been a principal communications route between major urban centres in Colombia's East and Central Andes, including the capital Bogotá and the Caribbean coast. Although much of the Magdalena Valley had been converted to agriculture as early as the 18th century, the humid middle section (between c.5° and 7°N) remained heavily forested until relatively recently. In the 1960s and 1970s, the Colombian government supported an internationally financed colonisation and infrastructure programme that resulted in the elimination of nearly four million ha of humid lowland forest⁴. Today, the Magdalena Valley is almost completely deforested and intensively farmed. Indeed, by the time Colombia's National Protected Areas network was being established in the 1970s, no suitable forest wilderness could be found for a National Park in the Magdalena Valley or adjoining subtropical Andean slopes. This was reflected in Conservation International's Global

Gap Analysis³, and highlighted at the World Parks Congress in South Africa in 2003.

Surveys in the 1990s by researchers from Colombia's Universidad Nacional led by F. Gary Stiles revealed Serranía de las Quinchas' subtropical forests to be 'essentially the only well-preserved cloud forest and the largest block of lowland wet forest in the region' and 'an important area for further study and a strong candidate for protective measures'⁴. AQ first surveyed the lowland fauna of Serranía de las Quinchas in late November 2003, finding six Critically Endangered species, four Endangered species and nine Vulnerable species, including nesting Blue-billed Curassow, Variegated Spider-monkey *Ateles hybridus*, tracks of Magdalena Tapir *Tapirus terrestris columbianus*, *Crocodylus acutus*, the Magdalena Bocachico fish *Prochilodus magdalenae* and Red-footed Tortoise *Geochelone carbonaria*.

AQ also learned that the company then owning much of the lowland and foothill forests of Serranía de las Quinchas had recently gone into liquidation and was engaged in a distress sale of its 848-ha stake. Satellite maps revealed this forest fragment to constitute a strategic buffer to a 3,000-ha forest wilderness. If this sale had proceeded, it would doubtless have led to colonists, farmers and coca growers purchasing the land, and to the eventual felling of its forests. A 30-day suspension on the land auction was negotiated and we immediately began to seek international funding to purchase and protect this unique forest.

During a hectic month, an emergency conservation proposal was circulated and funding secured with the assistance of American Bird Conservancy. The many organisations and people who generously assisted include Conservation International's Global Conservation Fund, the American Bird Conservancy and the Neotropical Bird Club. Soon after, Fundación ProAves secured title to the properties involved and a new protected area was established in early 2004. The new reserve has been named Reserva Natural el Paujil, after the local name for Blue-billed Curassow.

Importantly, it appears that Serranía de las Quinchas could comprise an important population stronghold of Blue-billed Curassow *Crax alberti*, given the lack of true protection of this Critically Endangered species elsewhere. Although there are populations in several reserves, including national parks (Paramillo and perhaps Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta and Tayrona), a fauna and flora sanctuary (Los Colorados), and other reserves (e.g. Bajo Cauca-Nechi, Cañon del Río Alicante, and Los Besotes)¹, such populations are subject to differing levels of illegal hunting and many are difficult regions in which to develop conservation projects due to Colombia's armed civil conflict. El Paujil bird reserve is important in being a location in which this species can be seen regularly and in safety. Several nests of the species were found during January and May 2004. A young bird whose parents were shot shortly prior to our work commencing in earnest was taken into care before being released and is frequently seen in and around the reserve centre.

Other threatened bird species present within the reserve include White-mantled Barbet *Capito hypoleucus* and Antioquia Bristle-tyrant *Phylloscartes lanyoni* (both Endangered), Turquoise Dacnis *Dacnis hartlaubi* and Saffron-headed Parrot *Pionopsitta pyrilia*, as well as Colombian endemics such as Sooty Ant-tanager *Habia gutturalis* (all Vulnerable). Comprehensive ornithological surveys in the region are not yet complete, although over 350 bird species have been recorded by Fundación ProAves researchers and others^{4,5} in the region to date (see Appendix). The global importance of the new reserve has already been recognised through the declaration of El Paujil as an Important Bird Area and an 'Alliance for Zero Extinction' site.

El Paujil reserve is strategically located, being just five hours via road from both Bogotá and Medellín. Seven researchers and a full-time forest guard now monitor and protect the forest; it is hoped that visiting researchers, volunteer conservationists and birdwatchers can sustain conservation activities and bring further benefit to the local community. A reserve headquarters with excellent facilities has been established and the main road to

the reserve centre improved. Already, Colombia's first certified course for bird ringing, a joint initiative between Fundación ProAves, Conservation International, the US Fish & Wildlife Service and Fondo para Acción Ambiental, has taken place in the reserve, and a project to study Blue-billed Curassow here won the BP Conservation Award's Silver Award. A community education programme has also been initiated, in which local students have been encouraged to visit the reserve. The local school has even changed its name to El Paujil as a result!

Although this beginning has been a great success, much conservation work remains to be done in Serranía de las Quinchas. We are acutely aware that to adequately protect minimum viable populations of the Blue-billed Curassow and other threatened and endemic species, we must protect much more than 848 ha. Fundación ProAves and its partners intend El Paujil reserve to become the core of a much larger reserve following further land acquisitions. We are seeking further funding with a view to purchasing of up to 5,000 ha of additional forest adjoining the new reserve and would encourage anyone who knows of potential donors to contact us.

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Appendix

Bird species recorded in Serranía de las Quinchas by ProAves researchers in and around El Paujil reserve (below 600 m), and by Stiles & Bohórquez² largely at higher elevations in the Serranía de las Quinchas (to 1,500 m).
