

#### WARPA (2019)

2 species >> Reserved sp.

6 species >> Protected sp.


2 species >> Protected species permitted for breeding

### Songbirds Status under WARPA(2019)



- > 228 protected species under WARPA (2019);
  - 214 species are listed as protected wild animal
  - 2 species are listed as reserved wild animal
  - 12 species are listed as breedable protected wild animals
- > 146 species are listed under CITES comprised of
  - 136 species are 'controlled wild animal'
  - 10 species are reserved; protected; and breedable protected wild animal

#### > Passeriformes 146 species of CITES-listed in Thailand under WARPA (2019);

- 136 species listed as controlled wild animal; a permit is needed for the export and import of the specimens in accordance with CITES provisions.
- 10 species, including reserved wild animals, protected wild animals, and breedable protected wild animals )
- Failure to comply or violations against this law are punishable in accordance with related provisions.







## Legal Trade


#### Domestic trade of songbirds

- The flourishing songbird trade in Thailand reflects the strong cultural connection to bird keeping and singing competitions within local communities or regions
- Species involved include breedable protected species and non-protected species.
- The market is particularly popular for species such as Spotted Dove (*Spilopelia chinensis*), Zebra Dove (*Geopelia striata*), and Red-whiskered Bulbul (*Pycnonotus jocosus*)



- 2. Hill Mynah (Gracula religiosa)



- 2 Sooty-headed bulbul (*Pycnonotus aurigaster*)
- 4 Black-crested Bulbul (*Pycnonotus melanicterus*)

## **Illegal Trade**

> Species of songbirds are illegally traded into international trade from Thailand :

#### 21 May 2019

The Nakornphanom Checkpoint have seized smuggled *Garrulax* spp. and *Leiothrix* spp., from Viet Nam to Thailand at the border.



The Chong Mek Wildlife Checkpoint and provincial police have seized smuggled 1,700 heads of Red-Whiskered Bulbul, which were contained in 12 baskets from Lao PDR to Thailand at the border, Ban Hin Soong, Sirindhorn, Ubon Ratchathani.








#### **Challenge**
