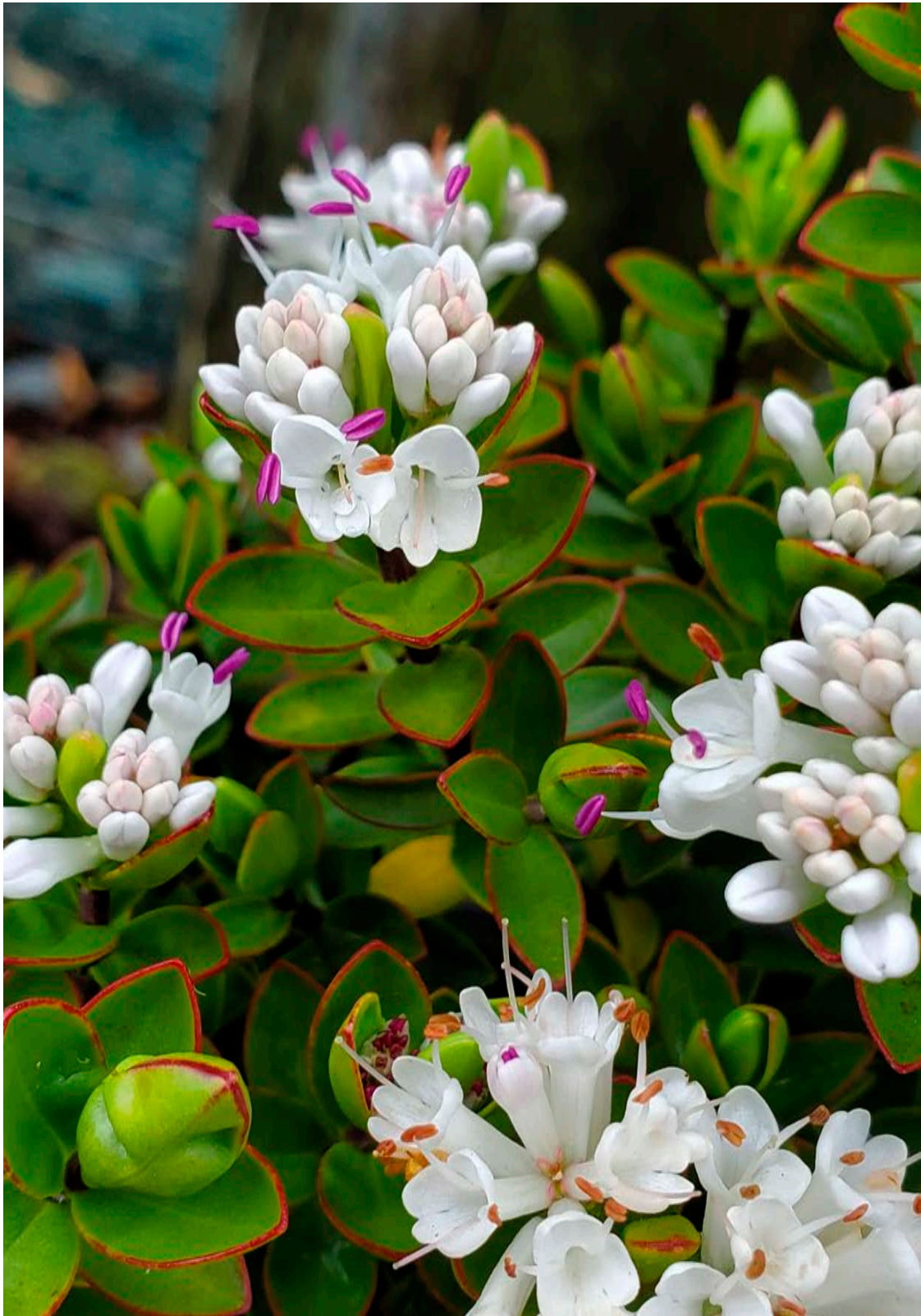

<i>Abelia grandiflora</i> <i>Glossy abelia</i>	Pretty hedge, dark green glossy leaf maturing to bronze, white flushed pink bell shaped flowers. 2 x 1.5m.	3.5L	\$12.00
<i>Abies koreana</i> <i>Korean fir</i>	A pyramidal tree with horizontal branches. Grey green needles, more heat/drought tolerant than most. Great Christmas tree. Evergreen. V hardy. 10 x 5m.	3.5L	\$15.00
<i>Abutilon mixed colours</i> <i>Chinese Lantern</i>	Evergreen shrub. Flowers can be pink, white, red, yellow or orange during summer. Prune after flowering to keep compact. The nectar is loved by birds and bees. Likes any reasonable soil. 2-3m unpruned.	3.5L	\$12.00
<i>Acacia baileyana</i> <i>'Purpurea'</i>	Well known ornamental tree. Foliage colour varies from purple to blue. Abundant yellow flowers in winter provide good bee forage and are very showy. Evergreen, hardy, OK near coast. 5-6m.	3.5L	\$12.00
<i>Acacia melanoxylon</i> <i>Tasmanian Blackwood</i> <i>Wattle</i>	A fast-growing, spreading tree. Timber is excellent for furniture or firewood. Impressive specimen tree and useful as shelter. <i>Acaena inermis</i> <i>'Purpurea'</i> <i>Purple bidibidi</i>	A compact and hardy herbaceous groundcover with a one metre spread. Its attractive deep purple leaves creating a mass effect.
