<b>Abies koreana 'Aurea'</b>	Golden Korean Fir	3'	1.5'		A golden-yellow form of Korean Fir that grows as a broad globe when young and later develops a leader and grows in a broadly upright form. The short needles are bright yellow to golden in color in the spring, becoming dull light green by
<b>Abies koreana 'Golden Glow'</b>	Golden Glow Korean Fir	1' - 2'	2' - 3'	dwarf	Golden foliage, yellow with white undersides, purple buds in late winter
<b>Abies koreana 'Horstmann's Silbrck'</b>	Korean Fir	12'	8'	small, pyramidal	Stunning two-toned needles are recurved, displaying the silver-white undersides which give a gleaming color and uncommonly beautiful textural effect

<b>Abies procera 'Hups 'Single Snake'</b>	Hupp's Single Snake Noble Fir	6' - 12'	3' - 6'		Long, straight branches that grow straight up with blue-green needles
<b>Cathaya argyrophylla</b>	Cathay Silver Fir/ Chinese Mountain Tree	65'		broad, upright or oval	Tall and broad. Branches arranged horizontally, young shoots striped brown with both long and short shoots
<b>Cedrus atlantica 'Sahara Ice'</b>	Sahara Ice Atlas Cedar	10' - 15'	8' - 10'		New spring growth that is white and then variegated through the summer months. During the fall and winter it becomes greyish and has white only on the tips of the twigs, and branches
<b>Cedrus deodara 'Prostrate Beauty'</b>	Prostrate Beauty Deadora Cedar	2'	8'	horizontal	This is an evergreen ground cover that grows in full sun. The blue-gray foliage is a real treat as it creeps over the ground.
<b>Cedrus libani 'Bergkristal'</b>	Dwarf Cedar of Labanon	36"	18"	upright when staked	Light green new needles eventually deepen to rich green over the course of the growing season. Its irregular habit lends it a naturally wild, windswept look, but it can also be staked or trained into a truly one of a kind specimen or serve as an
<b>Cedrus libanii 'Blue Angel'</b>	Blue angel Lebanon Cedar	12'	4'	weeping	Powder blue foliage; branches look like angel wings
<b>Cedrus libanii 'Green Prince'</b>	Green Prince Lebanon Cedar	3'	3'	dwarf	Bright green new growth; excellent Bonsai tree
<b>Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Prostrata'</b>	Prostrate Japanese Plum Yew	2' -6'	2' -6'	spreading, mounding	An evergreen, needled shrub or small tree in the Taxaceae (yew) family. The cultivar 'Prostrata' has a low growing spreading mounding habit.
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Aurora'</b>	Aurora Hinoki Cypress	1.5' - 2'	1' - 1.5'	conical/pyramidal	Broadly conical dwarf selection of Hinoki Cypress with dense, rich, greenish yellow foliage

<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Chirimen'</b>	Chirimen Hinoki Cypress	1.5'	1'	upright	Branching pattern resembles saguararo cactus; foliage is dark green with some variegation, named for the silk used to make kimonos
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Confucius'</b>	Confucius Hinoki Cypress	8' - 10'	6' - 10'	upright	Emerald green foliage tipped with gold
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Densa'</b>	Densa Hinoki Cypress	4" - 6"	4" - 6"	cushion/bun shaped	Densely structured miniature selection of Hinoki Cypress with congested, dark-green sprays of foliage
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Filicoides'</b>	Fernspray Cypress	5' - 10'	5' - 10'	conical/pyramidal	Varies from a broad bush to a narrow tree. Always slow growing, and usually gaunt and freakish in either case. Extenuated branches with densely congested short side sprays. Individual twigs fernlike
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Gemstone'</b>	Gemstone Hinoki Cypress	12"		conical/pyramidal	very slow growing, sculpted selection of Hinoki Cypress with a narrow, upright form. When young, it is reminiscent of a small, pointed wizard's hat. As it matures, occasional side branches will develop adding aesthetic interest to the already
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Gitte'</b>	Gitte Hinoki Cypress	1' - 1.5'	3'	spreading, mounding	Compact, mound-forming, evergreen, coniferous shrub with twisted stems bearing dense sprays of scale-like, golden-yellow to yellow-green leaves.
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Gold Drop'</b>	Gold Drop Hinoki Cypress	2'	1'	globe or globose	Flat-topped, semi-dwarf selection of Hinoki Cypress with spreading branches and creamy, yellow-green foliage
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Gold Post'</b>	Gold Post Hinoki Cypress	6'	2'	upright	Very upright growing hinoki Cypress. The golden fans of foliage are attractively twisted on this small plant
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Golden Pillar'</b>	Golden Pillar Hinoki Cypress	3'	1'	upright	Dwarf, upright evergreen selection of Hinoki Cypress with sprays of rich yellow foliage. Its overall structure is dense, compact and very narrow. It performs its best in sun or partial shade
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Green Pencil'</b>	Green Pencil Hinoki Cypress	4'	1'	narrow upright	Dwarf evergreen conifer with a narrow upright form. Congested foliage is a rich emerald green. Prefers sun/partial shade in well-drained soil
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Just Dandy'</b>	Just Dandy Hinoki Cypress	1.5'	2'	spreading, mounding	Compact sprays of dense, finely textured foliage decorate the branches of the low, rounded, spreading plants. Such tight foliage is usually associated with miniature selections that have extremely slow growth, but this superior cultivar grows
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Kosteri'</b>	Koster Hinoki Cypress	6'	4'	broad upright	Maintains a compact rounded shape for several years before eventually developing into a broad, but tidy, dense pyramid. Hints of bronze accent the tiers of soft, muted green branches, especially in winter
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Melody'</b>	Melody Hinoki Cypress	6'	4'	broad upright	Narrow when young, it broadens with age. Winter brings bronze tones to the tips of the yellow foliage for a nice seasonal change. Tolerates full sun but flourishes in partial shade as well
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Nana 'Gracilis'</b>	Dwarf Hinoki Cypress	8'	6'	broad upright	Has an irregularly globose form that develops an upright habit with age. Dense, extremely healthy, rich green cups of foliage suggest an elegant Japanese aesthetic. Slow growing, reliable structure, for full to part sun
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Rezek'</b>	Rezek Hinoki Cypress	16"	12"	narrow pyramid or columnar	A dense, slightly irregular, upright selection of Hinoki Cypress with short, tight branching and rich, congested, dark-green foliage
<b>Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Split Rock'</b>	Split Rock Hinoki Cypress	4'	3'	broadly conical	Dense branch structure and very blue foliage that grows as a combination of mature and juvenile types. It makes for an interesting subject for a mixed conifer border in sun or partial shade
<b>Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Blue Moon'</b>	Blue Moon Sawara Cypress	4'	4'	globe or globose	Bright steel blue foliage features short stiff branches covered with juvenile foliage that develop into a tight, compact ball An excellent choice for foundation plantings. Grows best in full sun with moist, well-drained soil
<b>Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Boulevard'</b>	Boulevard Cypress	12'	8'	broad upright	Silvery blue, plummy foliage and a full, pyramidal habit with somewhat open branching. Responds well to training and shearing
<b>Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Cream Ball'</b>	Cream Ball Threadleaf Cypress	6'	6'	mound	Fine textured foliage appears to glow with cream, light green and bluish accents.
<b>Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Curly Tops'</b>	Curly Tops Sawara Cypress	10'	8'	broad upright	Distinctive curly tips and silvery blue foliage. The uniquely twisted needles show off a gleaming silver side, and a dense, compact form. Can tolerate partial shade
<b>Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Tsukumi'</b>	Tsukumo Sawara Cypress	1.5'	1.5'	mound	Dense, finely textured foliage that forms a small cushion of green.
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Black Dragon'</b>	Black Dragon Japanese Cedar	10'	10'	upright	Slow growing, with dark green foliage and upright branching pattern.
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Dinger'</b>	Dinger Japanese Cedar	4'	3'	broad upright	Rounded and multi-branched shoots are cord-like and filled with awl-shaped bright green needles. Masses of decorative buds form on lightly sheared tips to create a full, well-rounded treasure. Appreciates protection from cold and desiccating
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Gyokuryu'</b>	Gyokuryo Japanese Cedar	12'	8'	broad upright or oval	Fast-growing, broadly conical selection of Japanese Cedar with coarse green foliage growing in sprays
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Little Diamond'</b>	Little Diamond Japanese Cedar	2'	3'	mound	A compact mounded shrub with tiny light green foliage, distinct texture and attractive light green foliage. The tiny scale-like leaves are highly ornamental and remain light green throughout the winter
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Ryoku Gyoku'</b>	Gyoku Japanese Cedar	8' - 10"	8' - 10"	globe or globose	Extremely slow-growing selection of Japanese Cedar with dense, miniature dark-green awl-like foliage that will assume a light-bronze cast in winter in colder climates
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Twinkle Toes'</b>	Twinkle Toes Japanese Cedar	3'	2'	mound	Bright yellow new growth appears to "twinkle"; good in rock gardens orientalis containers

<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Vilmoriniana'</b>	Vilmorin's Japanese Cedar	12" - 15"	12" - 15"	globe or globose	Irregularly dense dwarf Japanese Cedar with short, stiff branches and very numerous branchlets with slightly nodding tips. Foliage is very stiff and robust, light green in summer, turning russet-brown in winter
<b>Cryptomeria japonica 'Yokohama'</b>	Yokohama Japanese Cedar	2'	2'	globe or globose	Irregular-upright, miniature to dwarf selection of Japanese Cedar with random clumpy branching and curious, congested, dark-green semi-juvenile foliage
<b>Cupressus cashmeriana</b>	Kashmir Cypress	40' - 60'	15' - 20'	upright	Narrowly pyramidal shape with upright main branches and long (often several feet) pendulous branchlets bearing blue-green, aromatic foliage. Plant in full sun and irrigate occasionally. It is hardy to about 15-20° F.
<b>Cupressus macrocarpa 'Greenstead Magnificent'</b>	Monterey Cypress	3'	6'	low spreading mound	Low-growing Cypress sports unusual, silvery-blue foliage. Has a flat growth habit and slow growth rate
<b>Cupressus nootkatensis 'Green Arrow'</b>	Green Arrow Nootka Cypress	12'+	2'	upright weeping	A very narrow, fast-growing form of Nootka Cypress with strictly weeping branches and dark, blue-gray-green open foliage, the most blue of the pendulous forms. It will usually develop a wide skirt at its base with age and will occasionally develop
<b>Cupressus nootkatensis 'Jubilee'</b>	Jubilee Nootka Cypress	12' - 18'	4.5'	upright weeping	Graceful, narrow upright tree form of Nootka Cypress with pendulous branching that grows tightly against the trunk. Dark green foliage fully cloaks the tree in its entirety
<b>Cupressus nootkatensis 'Sparkling Arrow'</b>	Sparkling Arrow Nootka Cypress	15'	2.5'	upright weeping	Narrow upright, strict-weeping selection of Nootka Cypress with pendulous branches and foliage that is splashed with creamy white variegation
<b>Cupressus nootkatensis 'Strict Weeping'</b>	Strict Weeping Alaskan Cedar	25'	6'	upright weeping	Tall, extremely narrow with an uncommonly pendulous habit. The draping foliage hangs down, clasped tightly against the upright trunk. Mature trees develop fascinating character with secondary sub-leaders that reach out and create a close-knit
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Anny's Zebra'</b>	Anny's Zebra Maidenhair Tree	10'	n/a	dwarf	Subtly variegated leaves make this an unusual ginkgo
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Autumn Gold'</b>	Autumn Gold Maidenhair Tree, Autumn Gold Ginkgo	25'-50'	25'-35'	upright	Pest resistant and makes a fine street tree. Leaves are green turning to bright gold in the fall
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Chotek'</b>	Dwarf Maidenhair Tree	3' - 4'	3' - 4'	horizontal/weeping	The foliage is very tube-like while having a horizontal to weeping habit. Fall color is a bright school bus yellow
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Goldspire'</b>	Goldspire Ginkgo Tree	14' - 16'	5' - 6'	pyramidal columnar	Drought tolerant and adaptable to a variety of sites. Deep green foliage on a columnar tree turns bright gold in the fall
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Grindstone'</b>	Grindstone Ginkgo Tree	25' - 30'	5' - 6'	pyramidal columnar	
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Jade Butterflies'</b>	Jade Butterflies Maidenhair Tree	10'	n/a	vase-shaped, semi-dwarf	Deeply bi-lobed leaves resemble jade butterfly wings; showy golden yellow fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Jaded Jester'</b>	Jaded Jester Ginkgo Tree	5' - 6'		pyramidal columnar	Small tree with vivid variegation. Fall color is neon yellow.
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Jehoshaphat'</b>	Jehoshaphat Semi-Dwarf Maidenhair Tree	10'	4'	upright	A rare cultivar that has an extremely dense, irregular, upright form sporting yellow coloration mid-spring followed by medium green, then brilliant yellow in autumn. The fan-shaped leaves come almost full-circle and give this little dwarf a

<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Kew'</b>	Kew Maidenhair Tree			upright	Conical male ginkgo tree selection from Kew Gardens. Bright gold fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Kohout Pendula'</b>	Kohout Weeping Maidenhair Tree	12'	8'	upright	A weeping form found by Jorg Kohout of Germany
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Korinek'</b>	Korinek Maidenhair Tree	20'	10'	upright	Unique in that its leaves come in a variety of shapes. From the typical fan-shaped to straps and filaments, twists and curls
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Mariken'</b>	Mariken Maidenhair Tree	2' - 3'	2' - 8'	upright	Dwarf, low-spreading, somewhat weeping/pendulous male form that grows very slowly. Small green leaves turn a uniform golden yellow in autumn.

<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Munchkin'</b>	Munchkin Ginkgo	6'		semi-upright	Has the smallest leaves of all the dwarf Ginkgos, one quarter the normal size. 'Munchkin' has a semi upright shape with outwardly oriented branches and densely packed leaves
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Munchkin'</b>	Munchkin Maidenhair Tree	2'	1.5'	dwarf	Very small leaves; lives up to its Munchkin name; can be staked for some height orientalis allowed to be a ground cover; golden fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Peve Maribo'</b>	Peve Maribo Ginkgo	20'	10'	upright	Upright tree from Vergeldt Nursery, The Netherlands, has green and light green-cream variegated leaves. Lovely, soft coloring, and elongated, incised fan-shaped leaves
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Robbie's 'Twist'</b>	Robbie's Twist Maidenhair Tree	8' - 15'	8' - 15'	upright	Awkward at first, but gradually develops a unique irregularly branched upward growing clothed with more narrow fan shaped foliage that is often notched
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Rocky'</b>	Rcky Dwarf Ginkgo	2' - 3'	4'	spreading	Congested plants sport clean, blue-cast foliage through spring and early summer. By mid-summer the plants develop pale yellow edging that persists into autumn.

<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Sky Tower'</b>	Sky Tower Ginkgo	20'	6' - 8'	columnar	Grows upward in a tight column Color is a uniform light green in the spring which darkens up slightly in the summer.
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Snow Cloud'</b>	Snow Cloud Maidenhair Tree	10'	n/a/	upright	Unusual cream edging on foliage matures to light green; should not be planted in full sun orientalis it will burn; golden fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Spring Grove'</b>	Spring Grove Ginkgo	6'	4'	upright	Dwarf tree with an upright pyramidal shape and a dense compact form. The leaves are bright green in color and grow in a whorled arrangement around the branches. Fall color is brilliant gold
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Sunstream'</b>	Sunstream Ginkgo	8'	8'	broad oval upright	Small tree with green and yellow variegated leaves. The yellow stripes on the leaves are irregular and fade to a cream as the leaf matures. It is reported that this variegated form shows less tendency toward reversion to an all green leaf, which
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Troll'</b>	Troll Maidenhair Tree	2' - 3'	2' - 3'	dwarf	Shrubby mound-shaped plant; bright yellow fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Tschì Tschì'</b>	Tschì Tschì Maidenhair Tree	10' - 15'	3' - 4'	mounded	Shrubby, mound-shaped, dense plant; golden fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Weeping Wonder'</b>	Weeping Wonder Maidenhair Tree	5'	2'	dwarf weeping	Leaf color can vary from luminescent lime to pale green; gold fall color
<b>Ginkgo biloba 'Witches 'Broom'</b>	Witches Broom Maidenhair Tree	3'	3'	mounded	Small plant perfect for people who want a ginkgo but don't have much room
<b>Juniperus chinensis 'Daub's 'Frosted'</b>	Daub's Frosted Juniper	15"	5'	spreading	Golden yellow, frosted foliage tips create a striking contrast with the pendulous, blue green mature foliage. A good selection for mass plantings or a groundcover for hot, dry banks
<b>Juniperus communis 'Effusa'</b>	Effusa Juniper	2'	10'	spreading	Low, spreading form that adapts to any garden, even in shady locations. Its small needles grow close to the flexible, reddish brown stems, which show off soft, cinnamon brown tips when new, and mature to bright green as the season progresses.
<b>Juniperus conferta 'All Gold'</b>	All Gold Juniper	1'	8'	spreading	Visually stunning groundcover! Blazing, bright-yellow conifer with a prostrate growth habit that quickly covers the ground. The prickly awl-shaped foliage is very dense and turns a light bronze in winter. Best color in full sun.
<b>Juniperus conferta 'Silver Mist'</b>	Silver Mist Juniper	2'	10'	spreading	Low, spreading selection with thick, stiff branches and densely set, short branchlets. Sharp, blue-green needles have broad white, stomatal bands that contribute a silvery sheen to the appearance. New growth has a reddish brown tinge. Tolerant
<b>Juniperus horizontalis 'Golden Wiltonii'</b>	Golden Creeping Juniper	4"	2'	spreading	A ground-hugging dwarf conifer with bright, lemon-yellow spring growth
<b>Juniperus horizontalis 'Pancake'</b>	Pancake Juniper	6"	4'	spreading, layering	Feathery, scale-like foliage which covers the ground as it grows flat as a pancake. The branches will root as they creep along the ground. Gray-blue in color through the growing season, it takes on light purple hues in winter. Prefers full sun in dry,
<b>Juniperus horizontalis 'Wiltonii'</b>	Creeping Juniper	3" - 6"	6' - 8'	spreading	A ground-hugging, life loving, spreading dwarf conifer
<b>Juniperus scopulorum 'Moonglow'</b>	Moonglow Rocky Mountain Juniper	20'	8'	upright	Relatively narrow, upright-pyramidal selection of Rocky Mountain juniper with exceptionally showy, silvery blue foliage
<b>Juniperus squamata 'Holger'</b>	Holger's Juniper	4'	4'	spreading	The densely branched spreading form displays two toned foliage crested when new growth appears yellow, backed by the deep blue-green mature foliage
<b>Larix decidua Cherry Valley'</b>	Cherry Valley European Larch				Compact dwarf selection of European larch with semi-pendant, cloaked branching holding typical bright green foliage that turns golden yellow before shedding in fall
<b>Larix decidua Horstmann's 'Recurved'</b>	Horstman's Recurved Larch	12' - 15'	6' - 8'	upright	Twisting, turning branches; light green leaves in summer turn golden yellow in fall. Deciduous
<b>Larix kaempferi 'Blue Ball'</b>	Blue Ball Japanese Larch	1' - 2'		upright	A shrubby Larix that offers up pleasant blue-green foliage along a congested broad-mounded framework
<b>Larix kaempferi 'Diana'</b>	Contorted Japanese Larch	20'	7'	upright	Branches and needles twist and turn, giving tree a contorted look; soft blue green foliage turns golden yellow in fall. Deciduous
<b>Larix koreana 'Jacobsens Pyramid'</b>	Jacobsen's Pyramid Japanese	12'	8'	upright	A very narrow upright form of Japanese Larch. Branches all grow upward and are covered with bright green needles
<b>Metasequoia glyptostroboides 'Amber Glow'</b>	Amber Glow Dawn Redwood			pyramidal	Deciduous conifer, which has bright, golden foliage that emerges in the spring and becomes tinged with orange as the season progresses. The foliage doesn't burn in full sun.
