An Act to amend the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908. 9th November, 1920.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Orchard and Garden Diseases Short Title. Amendment Act, 1920, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in section fifteen of the Governor-General principal Act, the Governor-General may from time to time, by may suthorize Order in Council, make regulations authorizing the sale, under such sale in New Zealand of fruit conditions as may be prescribed in those regulations, of fruit affected affected by with any of the diseases mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) Such regulations may apply generally throughout New Zealand or within any specified part or parts thereof.

3. The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Power to extend Council, extend the Schedule hereto by including therein any disease Schedule. other than those mentioned therein.
