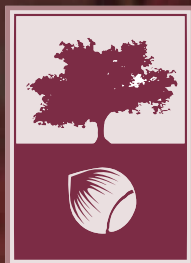

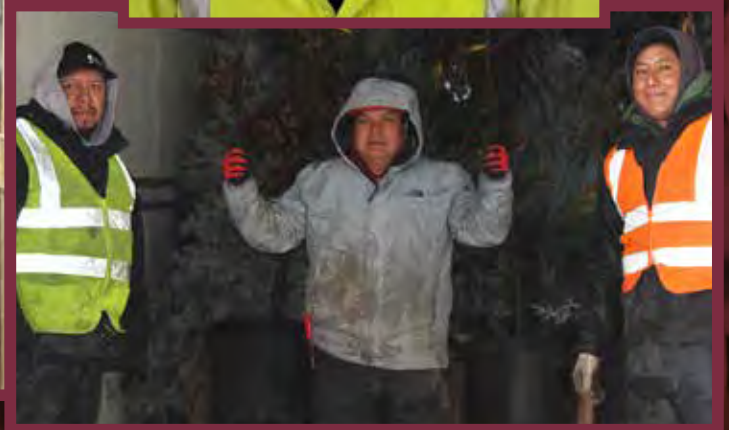

# ACER FAMILY

Bountiful Farms grows a large variety of Maple trees, 30 of which we graft here on the farm. Grafts are field grown for 3-4 years before being potted in a soil-less media.



# BUXUS FAMILY

We produce Boxwood in a broad variety of cultivars and topiary shapes. All Boxwood are machine sheared to produce a uniform, consistent product.





## HIBISCUS FAMILY

The lovely Rose of Sharon is a summer garden favorite since it blooms well into September; extending the color growing season. Rose of Sharon are available in both bush and standard forms.



## THUJA FAMILY

Thujas serve multiple purposes in the landscape. Best known for their excellent hedging properties, certain Thuja are also well-suited as large statement pieces. We also grow dwarf varieties that work well in smaller yards. All of our Thuja varieties are field grown and either machine or hand pruned in the field for a fuller, more vigorous plant.





# ESPALIER COLLECTION

Espalier is the ancient horticultural art of pruning and training a tree or shrub to grow flat against a fence or wall, creating a living sculpture. Espalier trees provide a focal point in a garden or landscape, as well as maximizing growing space. Espalier fruit trees provide easy picking since no ladder is required.

### **Abies concolor** **'Blue Select'**

Blue Select White Fir

Tall, pyramidal tree with soft, powder-blue foliage.



### **Acer palmatum**

Green Japanese Maple

Small tree forming a rounded crown. Deeply lobed, light-green leaves have nice fall color.



### **Abies concolor** **'Candicans'**

Candicans White Fir

Tall tree with open branching. Intense, large, bright silver-blue needles



### **Acer palmatum** **'Bloodgood'**

Bloodgood Japanese Maple

Slender, upright, airy form. Large deep-red leaves that retain color through the summer. Foliage turns brilliant scarlet in fall. Interesting blackish-red bark.



### **Abies koreana** **'Horstmanns Silberlocke'**

Handsome irregular branching form. The needles curl up, exposing bright silver undersides. Slow grower, less than one foot per year.



### **Acer palmatum** **'Emperor I'**

Similar to 'Bloodgood' in growth habit. Holds its red color well throughout the summer months, and has a brilliant crimson fall display. A very nice newer cultivar.

A very hardy tree selection with a fire red fall color. White, fragrant flowers emerge in the spring.



### **Acer palmatum** **'Fireglow'**

Fireglow Japanese Maple

An attractive medium sized maple; red foliage that emerges burgundy in the spring; small lobed leaves turn an outstanding crimson in the fall. This well-branched tree has a moderate growth habit and a broad crown with maturity.

Japanese Maple

A dwarf Japanese maple with clusters of layered green leaves. Foliage turns yellow and orange in the fall. Excellent specimen for a small garden.

Dwarf Japanese maple variety. Leaves are dark maroon during the summer, changing to a brilliant red in the fall.

This dwarf variety has deep red, almost purple leaves. More bushy and round than other upright varieties. Leaves turn fire engine red in fall.

Vigorous, upright form as a young tree becomes arching with age. The new leaves emerge crimson-pink with white margins that mature as a blend of pink, green and creamy white.

Coral Bark Japanese Maple

Young branches have vibrant coral red bark that intensifies in winter. Deeply cut light-green leaves display red margins in summer and turn golden-yellow in the fall.

Lions Head Japanese Maple

Slow growing variety with compact, glossy leaves that are curled up, making it like no other Japanese maple. Deep green foliage turns golden in fall and becomes covered with rose and crimson tones. Striking color lasts even in very hot sun.

Upright compact tree form. Branches are layered and weeping to the ground. Bright red spring color with dark red in summer.

A dense cascading tree with rich purple-red dissected foliage. Excellent color retention through the summer, turning bright red in the fall.

A fast growing palmatum selection. The vase shape young tree becomes broad as it matures. Spring leaves emerge red, turning to dark purple in the summer then turn to a brilliant scarlet-red in the fall.

A fast growing dissectum selection. New foliage emerges as bright orange-red that turns reddish-green in mid-summer. Fall color is a fiery orange-red.

Upright, somewhat columnar form. Red, small-lobed palmate leaves turn crimson in the fall.

Dark-purple foliage retains color throughout summer, even in shade. Slow-growing deciduous tree with elegant dissected leaves.

Low branching dwarf tree with cascading branches. Lace-like red foliage retains color through the summer.

Airy, bright green leaves in spring and summer. Fall colors are layered in shades of yellow, gold, and orange. Upright growth habit.

Dense, vigorous, cascading tree. Dark-red dissected foliage maintains its color even in the hot, humid summers typical of the eastern US. Leaves are more coarsely dissected than other varieties.



**Acer rubrum 'Franksred'**

Red Sunset® Maple

Small, red and yellow flowers emerge in spring followed by dark green summer foliage. This variety is most notable for its brilliant fire engine red early fall color. One of the hardier red maple varieties.



**Acer palmatum dissectum 'Viridis'**

Green Japanese Laceleaf Maple

Z5 / H6'xW10' / ○ D

Small, cascading mounded form. Bright-green, dissected foliage turns golden-yellow and red in the fall.



**Acer rubrum 'October Glory'**

October Glory Red Maple

A moderate to fast growing cultivar noted for exceptional fall color. Attractive red flowers in early spring before leaves appear.



**Acer platanoides 'Crimson King'**

Crimson King Norway Maple

Star shaped deep maroon leaves retain color throughout the season. Maroon-yellow flowers and brown seedpods attract birds. Shallow root system so avoid planting near sidewalks or driveways. Slow grower.



**Acer trunc. x plat. 'Crimson Sunset'® PP21838**

Crimson Sunset® Maple

Foliage similar to that of the Crimson King, but with a more compact and upright form. Flourishes in summer heat where few purple leafed plants will grow.



**Acer platanoides 'Crimson Sentry'**

Crimson Sentry Norway Maple

An upright, columnar tree with deep purple summer foliage that turns bronze in the fall.



**Acer trunc. x plat. 'Pacific Sunset'® PP7433**

Pacific Sunset® Maple

Outstanding glossy summer foliage changes to tints of yellow, red, and orange in fall. Fine textured branching with a wide spread.





### **Acer x freemanii 'Jeffersred'**

Autumn Blaze® Maple

A cross between red maple and silver maple that provides a great scarlet fall color. Grows well in alkaline soils where rubrums will not. Has the vigor of a silver maple without the narrow branch angles that cause wind breakage.



### **AMELANCHIER**

### **Amelanchier x grandiflora 'Autumn Brilliance'**

Autumn Brilliance® Serviceberry

Small, deciduous, multi-trunked understory tree. Three inch, white racemes of flowers bloom in April followed by edible fruits in June. Fruit is comparable to a blueberry.

### **Aesculus x carnea 'Briotii'**

Red Flowering Horsechestnut

A stately deciduous tree with stunning dark-red, cone shaped panicles in early summer. Flowers give way to prickly capsules containing nuts.

### **Betula 'Cesky Gold'® PPAF, CBR#5637**

Cesky Gold® Birch

Exceptionally cold-tolerant deciduous shrub. New growth appears in hues of red, yellow, and orange. Allow to grow naturally or prune into shape



### **Aesculus x carnea 'Ft. McNair'**

Ft. McNair Red Horsechestnut

Excellent rounded form. Bright pink blooms with yellow throats appear on flower spikes in spring.

### **Buxus microphylla 'Julia Jane'**

Julia Jane Boxwood

Upright, broadleaf evergreen shrub with a rounded habit. Tiny, white, fragrant flowers appear in spring.



### **ALBIZIA**

### **Albizia julibrissin 'Summer Chocolate'**

Summer Chocolate Silk Tree

Fast growing, deciduous tree has a wide vase shape. Leaves emerge as bronze-green and turn to a rich chocolate-burgundy as they mature.



### **Buxus microphylla 'Little Missy'**

Little Missy Boxwood

Little Missy is one of the most popular and beautiful boxwoods. Small leaves, a rounded, dense habit, and glossy, dark green foliage make it unique. It consistently ranked high in resistance to Boxwood Blight in a 2020 USDA analysis.

'Winter Gem'**

Winter Gem Boxwood

An evergreen Japanese boxwood cultivar notable for its winter hardiness. Its small, rounded leaves shift from green to bronze in winter before turning green again in spring.

NewGen Independence® offers classic boxwood beauty with good resistance to boxwood blight as well as good performance in boxwood leafminer trials. Similar to Green Beauty in growth habits, but with a more elongated leaf.



**Buxus microphylla  
'Wintergreen'**

Wintergreen Boxwood

Handsome, light-green small-leaved form that performs superbly in colder climates.



**Buxus sempervirens  
'Aureo-variegata'**

Variegated Boxwood

Slow growing shrub with green and yellow variegated leaves. Tolerates shearing well.



**Buxus microphylla  
'Sprinter'® PP25896**

Sprinter® Boxwood

Z5 / H4'xW4' / ○ ●

Named Sprinter because of its rapid growth rate, this improved variety of 'Winter Gem' is resistant to boxwood blight. Upright habit is great for low hedging or foundation plantings.



**Buxus sempervirens  
'Dee Runk'**

Dee Runk Boxwood

An excellent, multi-stemmed evergreen with upright columnar habit. Its narrow shape is ideal for formal hedges or topiary. Slow growing with dark green, small glossy leaves.

NewGen Freedom®  
'SB 300' Boxwood

Z5 / H5'xW5' / ○

NewGen Freedom® was selected due to its resistance to boxwood blight and boxwood leafminer. Its vigor helps it create an attractive plant quickly, but it also makes annual pruning a must. With annual pruning, this plant makes a fabulous specimen.



**Buxus sempervirens  
'Elegantissima'**

Elegantissima Boxwood

Z6 / H5'xW3' / ○ ◐

Green leaves with creamy white margins. Slow growing with a dense, upright habit. With minimal pruning, grows into a loose pyramidal shape.



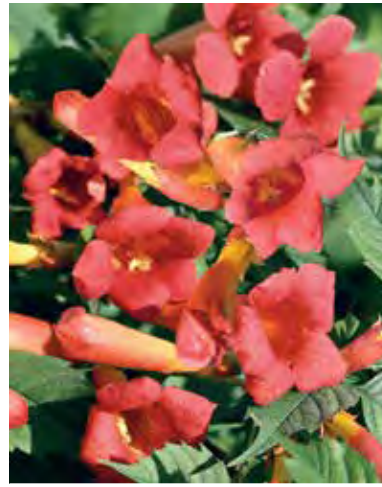


**Buxus sempervirens  
'Graham Blandy'**

Graham Blandy Boxwood

Z5 / H9'xW3' / ○

Attractive columnar upright form with dark green, rounded leaves and dense growth. Tolerates pruning well for use as a hedge.



**Campsis radicans  
'Indian Summer'**

Indian Summer  
Trumpet Vine

Z4 / H12'xW5' / ○

Woody vine with dark green leaves and clusters of orange-red trumpet-shaped flowers in early summer. Flowers are very attractive to hummingbirds. Takes full sun to part shade.



**Buxus x  
'Green Mountain'**

Green Mountain Boxwood

Forms a perfect, wide pyramidal oval. Small dark-green leaves excellent for hedges.



**CARPINUS**

**Carpinus betulus**

European Hornbeam

Z5 / H60'xW40' / ○ ◐

Hornbeam forms a beautiful formal hedge for landscapes. Leaves are dark green and turn brown in winter. Hardy and tolerates wet soils.



**Buxus x 'Green Velvet'**

Green Velvet Boxwood

Z5 / H'4xW4' / ○ ◐

'Green Velvet' is a broad-mounded, compact form of boxwood. Opposite, glossy, dark green leaves are evergreen. Inconspicuous pale green flowers.



**Carpinus betulus  
'Columnaris Nana'**

Dwarf Columnar  
European Hornbeam

Z4 / H8'x3' / ○

A superb hedging plant, Dwarf Columnar Hornbeam is a slow-growing upright deciduous tree with dense green foliage. Requires little pruning.

'Huitan'**

Tango Trumpet Vine

More compact than other trumpet vines. Features shiny dark green leaves, set off by red flowers in mid-summer.



**Carpinus betulus  
'Fastigiata'**

Columnar European  
Hornbeam

Z4 / H40'xW30' / ○ ◐

Bright medium green leaves are attractive throughout the growing season with little susceptibility to foliar diseases. Foliage turns yellow-orange in fall. Trunks have smooth gray bark and distinctive muscle-like fluting.





**Carpinus betulus  
'Frans Fontaine'**

Frans Fontaine  
European Hornbeam

Z5 / H35'xW15' / ○ ◐

Upright in habit, this hornbeam has ridged leaves that emerge a soft medium green and turn yellow in the fall. Great for small gardens.



**Cedrus atlantica  
'Glauca'**

Blue Atlas Cedar

Z6 / H80'xW40' / ○ ◐

Stately, erect tree with lace-like open growth. Silvery-blue needles. Small upright cones form near the end of the branches in the fall.



**Carpinus betulus  
'Lucas'**

Lucas Pyramidal Hornbeam

Z4 / H30'xW12' / ○

Narrower even than 'Fastigiata', Lucas' dense columnar shape is cloaked in dark green foliage well into fall. Brown foliage remains until replaced with new foliage in spring. Perfect selection for a tall hedge or as a pair flanking an entrance.



**Cedrus atlantica  
'Horstmann'**

Dwarf Blue Atlas Cedar

Z6 / H15'xW8' / ○

Semi-dwarf selection with densely-spaced needles. A much slower grower than the Blue Atlas cedar, growing 8-10' tall in 10 years.

'Fastigiata'**

Columnar Blue Atlas Cedar

Z6 / H40'xW15' / ○ ◐

Columnar variety of Atlantic Cedar. Strong main leader with all side limbs growing upward. Smokey, silver-blue needles. Narrow shape makes it ideal for borders or confined spaces.



**Cedrus deodara**

Deodar Cedar

Z7 / H50'xW30' / ○

Large, pyramidal conifer with beautiful gray-green foliage. The slightly weeping form gives it a graceful appearance. Extremely heat and drought tolerant once established.



**Cedrus atlantica  
'Glauca Pendula'**

Weeping Blue Atlas Cedar

Z6 / H20'xW20' / ○

Pronounced weeping habit. Needles are short, thick, and of irregular length. Trained to twisted form. Silvery-blue foliage.



**Cedrus deodara 'Aurea'**

Golden Deodar Cedar

Z6 / H35'xW15' / ○

Majestic, pyramidal shaped tree covered with golden yellow needles. Graceful, arching branches. Ideal for large landscapes.

'Karl Fuchs'**

Karl Fuchs Deodar Cedar

A hardy deodora cedar; new foliage emerges blue then turns green. It has an upright habit with pendulous branching.

Extra-hardy selection allows the far north to enjoy this charming woodland-edger with its crop of bright magenta spring flowers and heart-shaped foliage.



**Cedrus deodara  
'Prostrate Beauty'**

Prostrate Beauty Deodar Cedar

Z7 / H2'xW8' / ○

An interesting conifer with blue-green foliage. Grafted onto a standard, it forms an irregular shaped spreading canopy tree that remains relatively petite.



**Cercis canadensis  
'Ace of Hearts'**

Ace of Hearts Eastern Redbud

Z5 / H12'xW15' / ○ ◐

Compact redbud tree with a round canopy. Great accent tree for smaller yards or patios. Violet blooms emerge in early spring.



**Cedrus libani 'Pendula'**

Weeping Cedar of Lebanon

Z6 / H40'xW12' / ○

A thin, eccentric tree. Narrow, columnar habit with weeping branches makes this a unique specimen to any landscape.



**Cercis canadensis  
'Black Pearl™'**

Black Pearl™ Eastern Redbud

Z5 / H20'xW25' / ○

This unique Redbud really stands out with deep purple, heart-shaped foliage. Lavender blooms cover the tree in early spring before leaves appear. Will tolerate both sun and shade but achieves best color in full sun.

Epsteinianum Cyprus Cedar

Z5 / H50'xW30' / ○

Slender, irregular growing cedar showcases green needles with a silver-blue stripe. Very interesting and picturesque habit as a mature tree. Full sun, does not tolerate shade.

'Carolina Sweetheart®'  
PP27712**

Carolina Sweetheart® Eastern Redbud

Z5 / H25'xW30' / ○ ◐

In early to mid-spring, rosy purple flowers open along its branches and stems. The heart-shaped variegated leaves are shades of pink, red, white, purple, and green. This lovely redbud has a beautiful umbrella-like growth habit.

'Covey'**

Lavender Twist®  
Weeping Redbud

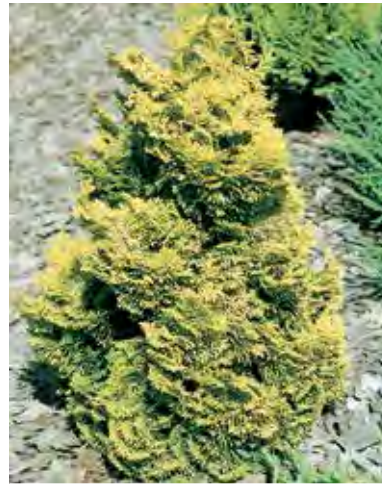

**Acceptance of Customer Order Conditioned on Customer's Assent to Terms Herein.** Bountiful's acceptance of Customer's order is expressly conditioned on Customer's acceptance of the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein. Customer shall be deemed to have accepted the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein if Customer accepts delivery of any of the trees. All sales of trees to Customer shall be governed solely and exclusively by the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein, and any additional terms set forth in Bountiful's signed acknowledgment, which terms and conditions shall supercede and prevail over all terms and conditions of Customer's order. Bountiful expressly rejects all terms and conditions of Customer's order and shall not be bound by any such terms or conditions in proceeding forward with the sale of trees to Customer.

**Price.** Bountiful's prices vary depending on the type and size of tree. Bountiful reserves the right to change its prices, and any price quotation made to a Customer, at any time and from time to time without notice. All prices charged Customer are exclusive of freight, shipping and insurance charges, and any sales, use, excise or similar taxes, all of which shall be paid by Customer.

**Duty to Inspect Upon Delivery.** Customer shall inspect all trees immediately upon delivery and shall give written notice to Bountiful within 10 days of the date of delivery as to any discrepancies between Bountiful's invoice and the quantity of trees received, or any claim that the trees are damaged or defective or do not conform to the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein. If Customer shall fail to give such notice, the trees shall be deemed to be satisfactory, and Customer shall be deemed to have accepted the same and shall be bound to pay for the trees in accordance with the terms set forth herein. Customer expressly waives any right Customer may have to revoke acceptance after the expiration of said ten-day period.

**Limited Warranty.** Bountiful warrants that all trees sold hereunder will be true to name. Customer acknowledges that no other representations or warranties have been made to, or relied upon by, Customer in proceeding forward with the purchase of the trees, specifically no representations or warranties have been made as to growth or livability of the trees, or the results of transplanting the trees after delivery, as growing conditions are beyond Bountiful's control and Bountiful cannot guarantee that any trees will live after delivery. Bountiful's limited warranty shall not be transferable and shall be null and void if Customer fails to pay for the trees in full when due.

**DISCLAIMER OF UNSTATED WARRANTIES.** BOUNTIFUL'S LIMITED WARRANTY IS THE ONLY WARRANTY APPLICABLE TO THE TREES SOLD TO CUSTOMER HEREUNDER. BOUNTIFUL MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES WHATSOEVER TO CUSTOMER AND SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER WRITTEN OR ORAL, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, OR ANY WARRANTIES ARISING FROM COURSE OF DEALING OR USAGE OF TRADE.

**Limitation of Liability.** Bountiful shall not be liable to Customer hereunder for any claim or damage in excess of the purchase price paid by Customer, and received by Bountiful, for the trees. Under no circumstances shall Bountiful be liable to Customer for any consequential, incidental, indirect, or special damages, or any punitive or exemplary damages, arising from, or in any way related to, the sale of the trees hereunder or Customer's use, or inability to use, the same, notwithstanding

any failure of essential purpose of any limited remedy herein. This exclusion shall apply regardless of whether such damages are sought based on breach of contract, breach of warranty, negligence, strict liability in tort, or any other legal or equitable theory. No action, regardless of form, arising out of the sale of trees to Customer may be brought by Customer against Bountiful more than one year after the date of delivery of the trees.

**Force Majeure.** Bountiful shall have no obligation or liability whatsoever arising out of or in connection with any delay or failure to perform any of its covenants or obligations under an accepted order, or any loss or damage incurred by Customer as a result thereof, if such delay or failure is caused, in whole or in part, either directly or indirectly, by crop growing conditions, fire, flood, frost, or other acts of God, strikes or other labor trouble, errors in count, or any other occurrence, act, cause or thing beyond the control of Bountiful, which prevents, hinders or makes fulfillment of the order impractical, any of which shall, without liability, excuse Bountiful from performance of the order.

**Restocking and Storage Fees.** If Customer refuses delivery of any trees after Bountiful has dug the same, Bountiful shall have the right to charge Customer a restocking fee equal to 15% of the purchase price of such trees, which restocking fee shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any and all other rights and remedies available to Bountiful. If Customer requests delivery of any trees after May 1st, Bountiful shall have the right to charge a storage fee equal to 5% percent per month of the purchase price of such trees.

**Off-Season Digging.** Bountiful commences digging its trees in the fall after it determines that the trees are dormant and continues digging so long as the trees remain dormant. Bountiful may, if Customer so requests, dig certain trees outside of Bountiful's normal digging season; provided, however, customer shall, in such event, pay Bountiful a special digging charge equal to 15% of the purchase price of such trees and shall assume all risks associated with digging the trees at a time when they are not dormant, including without limitation the risk of loss of the trees after they are transplanted.

### General Provisions

Bountiful has, with respect to all nursery stock bearing plant patent identification, grown such nursery stock pursuant to a license from the patent owner. Customer shall have no right to propagate or reproduce, and shall not propagate or reproduce, any such nursery stock without the express written permission of the patent owner.

These terms and conditions constitute the entire, final and complete agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to Bountiful's sale of trees to Customer, and shall supercede and replace all terms and conditions as set forth in Customer's order. None of the terms and conditions contained herein may be added to, modified, superceded or otherwise amended, unless such addition, modification or amendment is set forth in writing and signed by duly authorized representative of Bountiful.

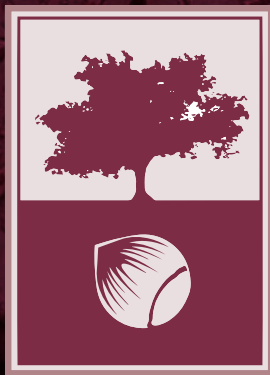
All rights, remedies and liabilities herein given to or imposed upon the parties shall extend to, inure to the benefit of and bind, as the circumstances may require, the parties and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and, insofar as this Agreement is assignable by the terms hereof, assigns.

In the event Customer fails to pay any sums owing to Bountiful, Customer shall reimburse Bountiful for all collection costs and expenses, including without limitation reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by Bountiful in collecting such sums. In addition, if litigation is commenced by either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement, or by reason of any breach of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable costs and attorneys' fees, both at trial and on appeal.

No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed, or shall constitute, a waiver of any other provision, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.

This Agreement shall be governed, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, without regard to its conflict of law principles. Any suit or action arising out of or in connection with this Agreement shall be brought and maintained exclusively in the federal or state courts in Portland, Oregon. Bountiful and Customer hereby irrevocably submit the exclusive jurisdiction of such courts for the purposes of such suit or action and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive, to the fullest extent permitted by law, any objection they may now or hereafter have to the venue of any such suit or action in any such court and any claim that any such suit or action has been brought in an inconvenient forum.
